**NEWINGTON COLLEGE ENDOWMENT FUND**

The Newington College Endowment Fund has been specifically established so that by 2040 we are able to fully fund the equivalent of 100 full fee paying student positions at the College at any one time. These will be bursaries for boys with promise and proven socio-economic need. Providing a Newington education to these deserving boys is aligned to our theme of empowering young men to “Discover what’s Possible” and is central to our Community values of diversity and inclusiveness, as well as to our social justice program.

Newington was founded on the guiding principles of education for boys of all faiths and backgrounds. The Endowment Fund enshrines, and is true to, our Founders’ ideals.

Bursaries already exist at Newington – be they Tongan boys from Tupou College, Sudanese boys garnered from our links with the Sudanese refugee community, Indigenous boys including the Chris Wild (ON 1991) Bursaries, or boys from any, and all, ethnic, religious and cultural backgrounds. The Endowment Fund represents a carefully constructed way of making bursaries a centre piece of our social justice program, and of Newington more generally.

**THE MULFORD BURSARY**

Newington’s Headmaster Dr David Mulford retires in 2018 after leading the College for 10 of its most successful years ever. As a driving force behind the renewal of the College, he is leaving magnificent legacies – physical, educational and pastoral - that will serve the sons of Newington for many generations.

However, it is the legacy of ‘Diversity’ for which David most wants to be remembered and it is therefore fitting that he has generously allowed his name to be applied to the College’s latest Endowment Fund Bursary – The Mulford Bursary - Celebrating Diversity.

Launched in June 2018, the Mulford Bursary has captured the imagination of the Newington Community with over \$100,000 raised to date. We have a total fundraising target of \$770,000, with the first boy to commence immediately those funds are achieved.

- The Headmasters suggested criteria for the Mulford Bursary is:
- 1. Parent background must be means tested (from a lower socio economic mix)
  - 2. Outstanding citizenship and character traits
  - 3. Leadership potential (positive influence on others)
  - 4. Someone willing to be an excellent contributor (at whatever level and to any of the many school offerings)
  - 5. Good track record of effort and a good attitude with their studies (does not need to be a high flyer -the effort/attitude rating is the key – they must be a positive influence on other boys)
  - 6. Someone who would benefit from our type of education and enhances the Newington ethos
  - 7. It is NOT for sport, academic or any other narrow focus.

**CHRIS WILD (ON 1991) INDIGENOUS BURSARY**

The Chris Wild (ON 1991) Indigenous Bursary was established in 2012. Chris Wild, the son of Rob (ON 1964) and Jenny Wild, was a teacher by profession with a passion for Indigenous education. Following his tragic death in 2011, the Wild Family, their friends and a number of generous Newington Old Boys established the Bursary in his memory.

The Wild Indigenous Bursary is the most significant of the named bursaries in our Endowment Fund with a current balance of \$2.4 million following a very successful Donor Matching program, which saw some \$1.2 million raised in 7 months.

The Wild Bursary has a goal to raise \$5 million. In the meantime, a group of Old Boys have gathered as Ambassadors for the College’s Indigenous Program and are generously personally funding all current bursaries in the name of Chris Wild. In this way, the Wild Bursary is already achieving whilst the Fund corpus is allowed to build.

The generosity of these Ambassadors, together with the fundraising to date, will now see a Wild Indigenous Bursary awarded each year from 2020.

However, we cannot rely on the generosity of a few to sustain this program. We need to raise a further \$2.6 million to make the Wild Indigenous Bursary self-sustainable and proudly welcome an Indigenous boy to the College, every year, forever.

**PHILLIP DAVIS OAM MATHEMATICS BURSARY**

In 2014, to celebrate his 90th Birthday, Phillip Davis OAM established a Bursary for a Year 7 boy of promise in Mathematics to have the opportunity of a Newington College education, irrespective of his family’s means.

As Co-patron of the Founders Society, the College’s Bequest program, Phil was keen to lead by example and provided for this Bursary in his Will. Phil was hopeful that after he was gone, Old Boys and their families that had benefitted from his teaching over the generations, would honour his life by contributing to his Bursary.

Phil served as a member of the College’s staff for fifty years – 1951 to 2000, making him the third longest serving staff member in the College’s history. He was a man of enormous influence and impact who gave a life of commitment, teaching and care to the young men in his charge.
